The month of October traditionally brings us the annual stewardship campaign. The theme for this year's campaign is, "Live Generously." "Now concerning the collection for the saints: you should follow the directions I gave to the churches of Galatia. On the first day of every week, each of you is to put aside and save whatever extra you earn, so that collections need not be taken when I come. And when I arrive, I will send any whom you approve with letters to take your gift to Jerusalem. If it seems advisable that I should go also, they will accompany me."

1 Corinthians 16: 1-4

For God loves a cheerful giver (2 Corinthians 9:7). Jesus teaches us that it is better to give than to receive. When the state of the world seems uncertain, giving generously might evoke a sense of fear. However, when we focus on God's abundant love for us as well as our love for God, we extinguish this fear.

Giving generously becomes embodied in us when we practice it daily, which in turn, creates spiritual discipline. God calls us to join in loving and caring for all of creation.

Giving generously cannot be done if it is compartmentalized. Rather, it is important to embrace the fullness of giving. Giving can be meaningful whether it is financial, sharing our gifts, talents and/or our time. It is important that no one feels left out of the opportunity to give.

"God has given each of you a gift from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another. Do you have the gift of speaking? Then speak as though God himself were speaking through you. Do you have the gift of helping others? Do it with all the strength and energy that God supplies. Then everything you do will bring glory to God through Jesus Christ. All glory and power to him forever and ever! Amen."
